



CDC Funding Gaps in the South Advocacy Toolkit: Alabama

The Problem

The Deep South, including Alabama, has the <u>highest death rates</u> from HIV of any other US region.¹

Alabama ranks 9th in the country in the rate of deaths among persons living with HIV.³

In the Southern region, including AL, more people die within 5 years of an HIV/AIDS diagnosis than in any other US region.²

Alabama ranked 13th in the country in the rate of new HIV diagnoses in 2014.3

CDC Funding Inequities


- Community-based organizations (CBOs) are especially qualified to provide HIV testing and other prevention services for hard-to-reach communities.
- CBOs <u>outside</u> of the Birmingham-Hoover metropolitan area were <u>completely</u> <u>left out</u> in recent HIV prevention funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). (Grant No. PS15-1502)
- CBOs in other Alabama cities were <u>not</u> eligible for funding under PS15 -1502.
- 74% of new HIV diagnoses in AL in 2013 were in areas left out of funding.⁴
- 68% of people living with HIV in AL in 2013 lived in areas ineligible for funding.4
- Despite high rates of new HIV diagnoses and people living with HIV, only one Alabama-based CBO (in Birmingham) received funding pursuant to PS15-1502.⁴

- 2. Community-based organization prevention dollars that are distributed consistent with the geographic distribution of the HIV epidemic.
- 3. Grants should include the opportunity to get technical assistance for smaller community-based organizations.
