# HIV IN FLORIDA, BY THE NUMBERS<sup>1</sup>



108,003: the number of Floridians living with diagnosed HIV in 2016.



**1st in the nation:** in the number of new HIV diagnoses in 2017.



**1st in the nation:** in HIV deaths in 2016.



**3rd in nation:** in HIV prevalence numbers in 2016.



## DEPENDS ON RYAN WHITE:2

- An estimated **56,677 Floridians** received services through Ryan
- White in 2015.
- 62.1% were living at or below the poverty line.
- Since Ryan White is legally required to be the "payer of last resort,"
- these people did not have other access to medical or support
- services.

## Federal Ryan White Funding in FL<sup>3</sup>



#### Florida received \$237.97 million in Ryan White funds in 2018<sup>4</sup>

- \$89.51 million went to AIDS Drug Assistance Program(ADAP).
- Over the past five years, annual funding increased 0.33%.
- The **Ending HIV Epidemic: Plan for America** would increase funding to seven counties: Broward, Duval, Hillsborough, Miami-Dade, Orange, Palm Beach, and Pinellas.

## Ryan White services keep HIV-positive individuals in treatment and care



With treatment, people with HIV can live active, healthy lives.



People whose virus is suppressed for 6 months cannot transmit HIV through sex.





But, if disconnected from care, resistance to medications can develop making it easier to transmit HIV.

Moreover, without treatment HIV is deadly. <sup>5</sup>

RYAN WHITE PROVIDES SERVICES ACROSS THE HIV CARE CONTINUUM

### HIV CARE CONTINUUM:

THE SERIES OF STEPS A PERSON WITH HIV TAKES FROM INITIAL DIAGNOSIS THROUGH THEIR SUCCESSFUL TREATMENT WITH HIV MEDICATION





While only **60** %of people nationwide have a viral load that is effectively suppressed as of 2015,<sup>6</sup>

85.9% of HIV-positive clients who had received at least one Ryan White funded medical care visit have achieved viral suppression.<sup>7</sup>



**17,881** Ryan White program clients with HIV in Florida were uninsured in 2015.8

No other program provides the same set of gap-filling services or care as Ryan White. Even after health reform, Ryan White remains crucial for Florida.
