# HIV IN TEXAS, BY THE NUMBERS<sup>1</sup>





**84,802:** the number of **4th in the nation:** in the Texans living with diagnosed number of HIV deaths in 2016.



4th in the nation: in HIV prevalence numbers in 2016.



3rd in the nation: in the number of new HIV diagnoses in 2017.



## DEPENDS ON RYAN WHITE:<sup>2</sup>

- An estimated 42,553 Texans received services through Ryan White
- in 2015.
- 67.6% were living at or below the poverty line.
- Since Ryan White is legally required to be the "payer of last resort,"
- these people did not have other access to medical or support
- services.



#### Texas received \$164.27 million in Ryan White funds in 2018 4

- \$68.82 million went to the AIDS Drug Assistance Program(ADAP).
- Over the past five years, annual funding increased by 5.87%.
- The Ending HIV Epidemic: Plan for America would increase funding to five counties: Bexar, Dallas, Harris, Travis, and Tarrant.

### Ryan White services keep HIV-positive individuals in treatment and care



With treatment, people with HIV can live active, healthy lives.



People whose virus is suppressed for 6 months cannot transmit HIV through sex.





But, if disconnected from care, resistance to medications can develop making it easier to transmit HIV.

Moreover, without treatment HIV is deadly. 5

THE SERIES OF STEPS A PERSON WITH HIV TAKES FROM INITIAL DIAGNOSIS THROUGH THEIR SUCCESSFUL TREATMENT WITH HIV MEDICATION



While only **60**% of people nationwide have a viral load that is effectively suppressed as of 2015,<sup>6</sup>
