# HIV IN VIRGINIA, BY THE NUMBERS<sup>1</sup>



**21,565:** the number of Virginians living with diagnosed HIV in 2016.



**13th in the nation:** in the number of new HIV diagnoses in 2017.



11th in the nation: in HIV prevalence numbers in 2016.



14th in the nation: in the number of HIV deaths in 2016.



## Virginia DEPENDS ON RYAN WHITE:

- An estimated 8781 Virginians received services through Ryan White in 2015.
- 56% were living at or below the poverty line.
- Since Ryan White is legally required to be the "payer of last resort," these people did not have other access to medical or support services.



## Virginia received \$46.8 million in Ryan White funds in 2018<sup>4</sup>

- \$18.64 million went to the AIDS Drug Assistance Program(ADAP).
- Over the past five years, annual funding has decreased by 7%.
- The Ending HIV Epidemic: Plan for America provides no funds for Virginia.

#### Ryan White services keep HIV-positive individuals in treatment and care



With treatment, people with HIV can live active, healthy lives.



People whose virus is suppressed for 6 months cannot transmit HIV through sex.





But, if disconnected from care, resistance to medications can develop making it easier to transmit HIV.

Moreover, without treatment HIV is deadly. <sup>5</sup>

While only 60% of people nationwide have a viral load that is effectively suppressed as of 2015,6

of HIV-positive clients who had received at least one Ryan White funded medical care visit have achieved viral suppression.<sup>7</sup>

RYAN WHITE PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR THE UNINSURED IN VIRGINIA.

Ryan White program clients with HIV in Virginia were uninsured in 2015.8

No other program provides the same set of gap-filling services or care as Ryan White. Even after health reform, Ryan White remains crucial for Virginia.
